STATUS: Serves as member of the AAUW-New Mexico Lobby Corps under direction of Public Policy Chair(s). No term limits.

QUALIFICATIONS: Interest in Public Policy and willingness to participate in lobbying and education activities. Takes training required to appropriately represent AAUW-NM.

VACANCY: Self-appointed.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Works with Public Policy Chair(s) to draft Legislative Priorities.

Learns the AAUW Principles and Priorities, and AAUW positions.

Maintains relationships and communications with National and State legislators or locally elected officials.

Contacts local, State and Federal elected representatives or public bodies on State and National Public Policy prioritized issues or presents AAUW position in hearings.

Participates in State Legislative Day Activities.

Is encouraged to attend the pre-legislative luncheon and/or the pre-Legislative Leadership Team Meeting prior to lobbying day.

Helps acquaint others with AAUW Lobbying Tools such as: Two-minute Activist and AAUW's Congressional Voting Record.

May become an issue expert for Lobby Corps and resource to legislators.

Needs to register with Secretary of State as an AAUW Lobbyist if Corps member will be speaking as a Representative of AAUW-NM.
